


Epworth Medical Foundation was established in 1982 to generate much-needed philanthropic support for the activities and equipment needs of Epworth HealthCare.

About the Jreissati Pancreatic Centre at Epworth

Pancreatic cancer is the eighth most diagnosed cancer in Australia. In 2020, it was estimated that 3,933 people would receive a pancreatic cancer diagnosis. This would account for 2.7% of all cancer diagnoses in the country, yet by 2030 it is expected that pancreatic cancer will be Australia's second biggest cancer killer.

The five-year survival rate of pancreatic cancer is less than 13% which is significantly lower than prostate cancer (a 95% 5-year survival rate) and breast cancer (a 91% 5-year survival rate). It is clear that this disease requires focused investment and research.

The Jreissati Pancreatic Centre is 100% funded by the generosity of donors who share our vision to provide hope and improve the life expectancy and prognosis for people with pancreatic cancer.

The Jreissati family knows the fear and uncertainty that follows a pancreatic cancer diagnosis. Knowing the impact it has had on their family, the Jreissati's wanted to change the patient and family experience for others. This has led to the establishment of the Jreissati Pancreatic Centre at Epworth.

What sets the Jreissati Family Pancreatic Centre at Epworth apart from other organisations in Australia is its structure. The centre comprises of three distinct parts:

1. Clinical care

Essential when trying to achieve better patient outcomes, this specialist centre offers centralised care for pancreatic disease. This means that patients can access all the different healthcare professionals needed for their care within our centre and hospital network. Overseas studies support the theory that centralised care improves patient outcomes. Having patients come through one main centre increases case volume, which in turn increases clinical expertise. This expertise leads to breakthroughs that will improve patient procedures and treatment in the future.

The vision for the Centre is to:

- > provide centralised care by having health professionals available in one place
- aim for patients to see a specialist within3 days of their suspected diagnosis
- patients will have a nurse coordinator assigned to them who will be their point of contact throughout the treatment process
- provide the tools and education that general practitioners (GPs) need to help identify pancreatic cancer earlier. Early diagnosis is the key with this cancer
- > create a centralised knowledge base on the disease that offers the same information to everyone in Australia and to the world
- > pioneer new diagnosis and treatment options for people with pancreatic disease.

2. Patient experience

A pancreatic cancer diagnosis is an emotional time, and it raises many questions. Knowing who you can turn to for support is important. Once a patient is referred to the centre, they will meet our pancreatic nurse coordinator. They'll be a patient's first point of contact relating to their care at Epworth and will be able to answer any questions that a patient or their family has.

3. Research

There has been little improvement in patient outcomes because pancreatic cancer has not received the same level of research funding as many other cancers. To change the future of pancreatic cancer, the centre will run research studies and clinical trials for pancreatic disease.



